#### Situation Overview

Hurricane Michael




- Michael has become a hurricane this morning and will move through the central and northern Gulf Tuesday through Wednesday
- Ahead of any direct impacts from this storm, strengthening winds over the Gulf will lead to higher than normal tides along east and southeast facing shores of Southeast Louisiana and Mississippi. A Coastal Flood Advisory remains in effect.
- The greatest impacts are currently expected to remain east of the local area, but if the forecast track shifts westward or if any bands move through the local area, strong/gusty winds and locally heavy rainfall will be possible

**NOTE:** Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.


- Michael has been upgraded to a Hurricane and is expected to continue to strengthen as it moves through the Gulf.
- The storm will impact the northern and northeastern Gulf coast late Tuesday through Thursday
- Tropical watches are not out for our area yet but may need to be expanded this afternoon or tonight if there is any adjustment to the west in the track.



Hurricane Michael









## TS Wind Speed Probabilities

Hurricane Michael






- There has been no changes in the probability of tropical storm force winds across extreme southeast Louisiana and southern/coastal Mississippi since the previous advisory.
- There is still a 3 to 4 in 10 chance of sustained tropical storm force winds for locations in lower Plaquemines Parish.
- There is a 1 to 3 in 10 chance of sustained tropical storm force winds for locations east of a Port Fourchon to Shell Beach line in Louisiana and across most of the Mississippi Coast. Extreme southeast Jackson county does have a slightly higher probability.

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## Most Likely Time of Arrival

Hurricane Michael






- The most likely time of arrival of Tropical Storm Force Winds at the coast is overnight Tuesday night and early Wednesday morning.
- However, Tropical Storm Force Winds could begin at the coast as early as midday Tuesday

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# Coastal Flood Advisory

#### Hurricane Michael






- Tides of I to 2 feet above normal especially for east and southeast facing shores. Isolated problem areas could be 3 feet above normal.
- Peak coastal flooding will occur during high tide today and Tuesday
- Flooding of low lying coastal roads outside of the hurricane risk reduction system will be possible.

### Expected Storm Total Rainfall

- Storm Total rainfall forecast
   valid Today through Thursday
- Locally, most rain will occur
   Tuesday Night
- Will note that we will be on the drier side of the storm so there will likely be a sharp cut off in rain from east to west and we may not see much rain at all.

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- Now Hurricane Michael is expected to move through the central and northern Gulf Tuesday and Wednesday
