Subject: Customs Broker Permit User Fee Payment for 2022

### ANNUAL PERMIT USER FEE

In accordance with 19 CFR 111.96 (c), an annual permit user fee will be assessed for each permit held by an individual, partnership, association, or corporate broker. This fee is not required from licensed individuals who do not hold permits.

The fee is payable for each calendar year in each port where a broker has a local permit to conduct Customs business. The fee is also applicable for each national permit held by an individual or cooperate brokerage and is payable at the port the license was issued through. As of January 1, 2022, the annual user fee for each permit has been increased to \$153.19. The 2022 annual permit user fee is due January 31, 2022, as published in the Federal Register notice dated November 23, 2021.

If any broker fails to pay the fee by the due date, the Base Metals Center Director will notify the broker in writing of failure to pay and revoke the permit to operate. This notice shall constitute revocation of the permit.

A broker whose permit has been revoked may reapply for a permit but will be required to pay the \$100.00 application fee as identified in 19 CFR 111.96 (b) in addition to the annual user fee.

If the broker reapplies within a reasonable time after revocation of the permit, the Center Director may issue a permit without regard to the provisions of 19 CFR 111.19 (e).
